Pat the Person!

"...by their fruit you shall know them." Matthew 7:20 Tuesday morning, June 28, we awakened to the sad news that our beloved Lady Vol coach, Pat Summitt, had went to be with her Lord whom she loved and served. While the media recounted her many accomplishments, WNML, a Knoxville sports radio station spent hours talking about Pat the person. Growing up on a Middle Tennessee farm, she knew the value of hard work. She also learned to compete in a man's world, playing basketball in a barn against her older brothers. She became an accomplished player at Cheatham County High School near Ashland, Tennessee and UT Martin. She was hired as a graduate assistant at UT Knoxville by Helen Watson, the chairperson of the physical education department. She was asked to coach the women's basketball team, following Margaret Hutson who wanted relief from this duty. Pay was \$250 per month and included menial tasks such as washing team uniforms and driving the team bus. She literally built Lady Vols Basketball from the gym floor up. She would go on to become the winningest Division I NCAA basketball coach ever with 1098 wins with 47% against ranked opponents. What was the secret to her success?

I believe that it started with a deep abiding faith in Jesus Christ. In the original press release by the family, they noted that while she had accomplished much, the most important one was to know and serve her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Prayer and Bible reading were a part of her daily life. She loved people, never met a stranger, and always had time to speak and sign autographs. Her players were her family. She once said, "What I see are not the numbers. I see their faces." When news of her shortening days was released, her family of young women that she had coached came to be with her. At the private funeral, over 30 came to share a final experience with their heloved friend.

Pat's success can also be attributed to a servant heart. No job was too small or menial. If something needed to be done, she did it. Once she was invited as a guest speaker at a middle Tennessee event. Afterwards she was invited to a sponsoring coach's home so people could meet and greet her. After a period of time someone asked, "Where's Pat?" She had quietly slipped away to the kitchen, washing dishes.

Jesus once said, "By their fruit you shall know them." Pat the person, rest in peace. You have fought the good fight. You have finished the course. You have kept the faith. You will receive your crown of righteousness that The Lord will present on the day of His coming, not only to you but to all those that will love his appearing. Pat's challenge to you is to be part of that gathering.
