# **MAXIMS for CHRISTIAN LIVING**

General Robert Reese Neyland served 3 times as football coach at the University of Tennessee built around 3 call-ups by the US Army during wartime and national emergencies. He is the school's winningest football coach with a record of 173 wins, 31 losses, and 12 ties. In 1938-1939 the Vols shut out 17 straight opponents for 71 consecutive quarters. The 1939 squad is the last NCAA team in history to hold every regular season opponent scoreless. Ironically, the University of California Trojans held him scoreless in the Rose Bowl.

General Neyland was an innovator and a motivator. The stadium at Shields-Watkins field was designed by him and became the long-term plan for a seating capacity of over 100,000 fans. It was a far cry from the 1925 capacity of 3,200 people when he first arrived at UT. The stadium was later named for him.

During the 1930's, Neyland began having his team recite 7 sentences that summarizes everything it takes to win a football game. I became aware of them this week when I met with Eddie Speeks who handles sound and video at UT's games. He introduced me to Sterling Henton, a well-known local DJ, who was quarterback from 1987-1990 at UT. The statements were later termed the "7 Game Maxims" and are recited to this day by every team in the locker game before every game.

- The team that makes the fewest mistakes will win.
- Play for and make the breaks and when one comes your way SCORE.
- If at first the game or the breaks go against you, don't let up... put on more steam.
- Protect our kickers, our QB, our lead and our ball game.
- Ball, oskie, cover, block, cut and slice, pursue and gang tackle... for this is the WINNING EDGE.
- Press the kicking game. Here is where the breaks are made.
- Carry the fight to our opponent and keep it there for 60 minutes.

These could become principles for Christian living. As I thought about them, I pondered on "Game of Life" maxims that we could recited every day to prepare us for its events. They could include:

- 1. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. Mark 12:30
- 2. Love your neighbor as yourself. Mark 12:31
- 3. Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. Prov 3:5 In all your ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct your paths. Prov. 3:6
- 4. Don't worry about anything; pray about everything; tell God your needs; thank Him for His answer; do this and you will experience God's peace. Phil 4:6-7 (TLB)
- 5. I can do all things through Christ...that strengthen me! Phil 4:13
- 6. My God will supply all my need, according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus Phil. 4:19
- 7. Confess my sins and He in His faithfulness will forgive my sins and cleanse me from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:19


