Then Anne Lacy and I would decorate the tree and Mother would referee. She divided the tree so that I decorated one half and Anne Lacy the other half. I was a fast decorator!!!! It was obvious which side was mine. Then the wait began for that special day!!!

I have so many special memories growing up. Church was also a special place for me. We were at church for all services. One of my first memories was Mrs. Annie Austin's Sunday school class at the back of the church around a little wooden table. The Easter egg hunts, the hikes up to the top of Crockett's Ridge (of course before it was developed.) Sitting in my pew, during a revival, and knowing at the end of that service that I had could not stay there. I just had to walk to the altar to accept Jesus Christ as my Savior!!! I became a Christian and a member of Economy UM Church. When my family began coming to Talbott CP Church, we changed our membership here. I had memories at Economy and now I have many memories at Talbott. Our sons grew up here and have their "church" memories. Our first morning worship service here was The Second Sunday of Advent, December 8, 1996.

Forward in Faith It's hard to believe that we have been worshiping in this facility for twenty years. The journey to be here was a tribute to the congregation's faith, dedication, stewardship, and hard work. After determining that the existing building on Talbott-Kansas Road was structurally unsound, the commitment to relocate was started in the late nineteen eighties. God opened the door to obtain this property which was part of the Cornwell farm. The church agreed to build a new building with a targeted budget of three hundred thousand dollars plus the property. Several preliminary drawings were done and Fred Ward in Johnson City was hired as the architect. Numerous drawings were completed before one was agreed to. When half the projected cost was in the bank, we broke ground in late fall, 1994. Gary Epps was the contractor and Quentin Herron was the job superintendent. As work continued, things were added and I became concerned that costs were greatly exceeding the original budget. I continued to pray hard, keeping Philippians 4:6&7 as my theme verses. The Building Fund continued to grow. I stayed in touch with our banker, Randy Hall at Union Planters Bank and he assured us to not worry, and they would take care of the loan increase. Work continued through 1995 and into 1996. We wanted to be completed by October for the fall meeting of presbytery which we had committed to host. Even though carpet and tile was not down, we used chairs and hosted the event including the first worship service October 5, 1996. We continued our Sunday worship in the old location until December 1, 1996. We started that service at the old building and all who were able, walked to the new building for our first congregational service. The new pews arrived in mid-December and the project was completed. In the end the total cost including furnishings and organ was almost a million dollars. The church contributions were over six hundred thousand dollars and the original bank loan was three hundred and seventy five thousand which was paid in less than ten years. The Lord had truly blessed the church and its efforts.

I have learned many things from my twenty seven years at Talbott. God is always faithful and when he gives you a vision and a call, stay on task and through faith remain committed to see it completed. Faithful living is demonstrated through faithful giving of time, talents, and money. Ninety percent of the relocation project was given by the congregation and its extended family.

When concerns and disagreements arise, pray earnestly and God will provide a solution. The Holy Spirit works for unity, not disharmony. Finally, it's easier to build a church building than a church congregation. We stand at the threshold of continuing that journey. Pray as earnestly, work as diligently, and give as generously toward that effort as the congregation of the last century did in theirs. Find your place of service and join in the ministry walk to bring Jesus Christ into the lives of this community.
