A Time to Plant

"There is an appointed time for everything. And there is a time for every purpose under heaven. A time to give birth and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to uproot what is planted." Ecclesiastes 3:1-2

This time of year brings back a lot of fond memories of helping my grandparents plant their gardens. Mamaw and Papaw Burnett had as many as three gardens at one time. There was the main garden in the back yard. It had a little bit of everything: tomatoes, cucumbers, squash, rhubarb, corn, and green beans. There was always a row or two of "early corn" along with a few rows of "candy corn". The green beans were mainly "red peanut", but there was also a row or two of "half runners" or something else. There was also another patch of corn behind the toolshed and the imposing potato patch out past the garage with seemingly endless rows of both white and sweet potatoes. Papaw had worked the ground with the disk and tiller. The holes or furrows were made, fertilizer was dropped, seed was dropped or plants placed, the dirt turned back over, then some water was sprayed on top. We worked, we sweated, we told stories, we laughed, and we (the kids) prayed to get done soon and get back inside to the air conditioning. Then we (the kids) waited for the food to appear. I was not as involved in the nurturing and weeding of the gardens as the plants grew; I was more involved helping Papaw and Dad with hay or cattle, but Mamaw, Mom, and Deanna spent many hours making sure the gardens were well tended. All the hard work was worth it when it came time to harvest, cook, can, and freeze. Few foods compare to fresh beans and corn and potatoes. I don't remember being so fond of it at the time when we were doing all the hard work, but looking back I see it as a time of bonding with those I now miss, and I wish we could do some of that hard work together again.

Our daily lives as Christians in this sometimes cruel world are like those days in my grandparent's garden. We work to serve God in whatever He sets before us each day in our work and in our play, in our job sites and in our homes, in our coming and in our going. We try to be a witness to those we encounter, to instill God's word in our children, to not be a stumbling block to others. Just as my family spent a lot of time nurturing the plants while they were growing, we have to keep working the fields in which we are placed. Sometimes we see the fruit of that labor, but many times we do not. After all, it is God that does the growth, not us. In the end, we will see God's great harvest, but for now, our responsibility is to work the fields, and the gardens, He sets before us each day.
