Via Dolorosa

As we pray for friends traveling to the Holy Land this month, we (Mark and Karen) remember our own trips to the places where Jesus and his disciples once ministered. The ancient walled city of Jerusalem is an incredible sight. At its center is the Temple Mount, with the golden Dome of the Rock, where Abraham is thought to have attempted to sacrifice his son. Orthodox Jews gather daily at the base of Temple Mount at the Western Wall for prayers.

One still enters the old city through one of the ancient gates. The city is now divided into four quarters: a Muslim Quarter, a Jewish Quarter, a Christian Quarter, and an Armenian Quarter. There is a unique character to each section of the city, but walking through the streets, one truly hears voices from all over the world.

During this month, many Christian pilgrims will make their way to the Christian Quarter in the old city of Jerusalem in order to walk the Via Dolorosa. In Latin, "Via Dolorosa" means the Way of Sorrow or the Way of Suffering. It is believed to be the path that Jesus walked on his way to his crucifixion, a winding route from the Antonia Fortress to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, which rests on the place once known as Golgotha.

Along the route, there are nine Stations of the Cross, including sites that mark the places where Jesus was thought to have fallen and the station where Simon of Cyrene took Jesus' cross and carried it for him. It is a powerful experience to walk that path and remember what Christ has done for us.

Most of us will not walk the Via Dolorosa this month, but we can all take time during the season of Lent to reflect on what Christ has done for us. Jesus' death and suffering made a way for our new lives and salvation, and Christ's resurrection gives us hope for the future.

Whether or not we travel to the Old City, we are all on a pilgrimage to understand the nature of this salvation. We can contemplate that Jesus is calling us to take up our crosses and follow him. Jesus has endured terrible hardship for us, so we are not alone on our pilgrimages through the land of suffering. God is with us. Christ is our companion, and ultimate as Christians we share in Jesus' victory.

We will end this month with the end of Lent, and on April 1, we will celebrate the greatest day in history. As we contemplate the way of the suffering, the Via Dolorosa, we are preparing for the tremendous celebration of Jesus' triumph on Easter Morning.

Join us in making this month a time of preparation for that great day!
